
Keeping Family Connections (KFC)

Keeping Family Connections, a program of Twin Cedars Youth and Family Services, Inc., was established in 2014 to address the need for supervised visitation in a safe, neutral environment. Accepting referrals from courts, attorneys, Guardians Ad Litem, and DHR, our trained staff provide supportive visitation using the "supportive supervision" model. This model includes real-time parent training and feedback, with the goal of stabilizing families and transitioning to unsupervised visits.
